Friday, 8:45 am to 10:45 am The Balancing Act: Ethical Decision Making in Dysphagia Management (S28)

Presented by Kristie Soriano, MS, CCC-SLP Lynn Cerillo, MS, CCC-SLP Amanda Dell'Aira, MS, CCC-SLP

This session is designed to present a framework to move from an impairment-based approach to shared decision making to optimize patient centered care and quality of life. For many SLPs this means recommendations for diets that are more liberal than are in their comfort zone. In order to encourage shared decision, this session will replace some current dysphagia management techniques with ethical rationale to support a patient's right to choose and refute treatment. Strategies to assist "in the conversation" will include emphasis on InterProfessional Practice (IPP) which in the medical setting includes the physician, dietician, and nurse.
